The CANopen to DeviceNet Gateway is an electronic device mountable on rail DIN with an autonomous energy supply that allows the following characteristics:






Figure 1: Connection scheme of HD67134 between a CANopen and DeviceNET




Figure 2: Connection scheme for HD67134

#### **CONFIGURATION:**

To configure the CANopen Gateway, use the available software that runs with Windows, called SW67134. It is downloadable on the site <a href="https://www.adfweb.com">www.adfweb.com</a> and its operation is described in this document.

The Gateway CANopen to DeviceNet is configured up to a maximum of 32 bytes in reading and 32 bytes in writing.

#### **INTRODUCTION**

The device Configurable Gateway CANopen to DeviceNet, allows a CANopen network to communicate with a DeviceNet network that we simply call CANopen and DeviceNet in this manual.

You need Compositor SW67134 software on your PC in order to perform the following:

- Define the BUS setting;
- > Define SDO, in read and write, accessible from DeviceNet;
- > Define Transmit and Receive PDO accessible from the DeviceNet;
- > Create EDS file for the CANopen side.
- > Save, duplicate, modify, and export configurations.

#### **USE OF COMPOSITOR SW67134:**

When launching the SW67134 the following window appears. The SW67134 is downloadable on the site <a href="http://www.adfweb.com/home/download/download.asp">http://www.adfweb.com/home/download/download.asp</a> (This manual is referenced to the last version of the software present on our web site).

## **NEW PROJECT / OPEN PROJECT:**

The "New Project" button creates the folder which contains the entire device configuration. A device configuration can also be imported or exported:

- > To clone the configurations of a Programmable CANopen to Modbus Gateway in order to configure another device in the same manner, it is necessary to maintain the folder and all its contents;
- > To clone a project in order to obtain a different version of the project, it is sufficient to duplicate the project folder with another name and open the new folder with the button "Open Project".

When a new project is created or an existent project is open, it will be possible to access the various configuration sections of the software:

- "Set Communication";
- "Set SDO Access";
- "Set PDO Access".

#### **SET COMMUNICATION:**

This section defines the fundamental communication parameters of two Buses CANopen and DeviceNet.




Figure 4: "Set Communication" window

By pressing the "Set Communication" button from the main window for SW67134 (Fig. 3) the window "Set communication" appears (Fig. 4).

The means of the fields for the "CANopen" section are the following:

- > In the "ID Dev." field you define the Gateway address of the CANopen BUS;
- > In the "Baud rate" field you define the CANopen BUS baud rate;
- > In the "Set Operational State at Start Up" field you define the state of Operational at start-up;
- > In the "Network Start at Start Up" field you define a command of start (operational) to all the devices in the CANopen network;
- > In the "Delay" field the delay before sending the network command for the CANopen is defined.

The means of the fields for the "DeviceNet" section are the following:

- > In the "ID Dev." field you define the Gateway address of the DeviceNet BUS.
- > In the "Baud rate" field you define the DeviceNet BUS baud rate.

"SDO Timeout" is the is the maximum time that the device attends for the answer from the Slave interrogated.

#### **SET SDO ACCESS:**

The following objects can be defined within the "Set SDO Access" section:

> the SDO of the CANopen are accessible from the array of Byte of the DeviceNet.




Figure 5: "Set SDO Access" window

By pressing the "Set SDO Access" button from the main window for SW67134 (Fig. 3) the "Set SDO Access" window appears (Fig. 5).

The data of the columns have the following meanings:

- In the field "ID Dev" insert the address of the CANopen device which requires the SDO;
- > In the field "Index" insert the index of the SDO (coordinated with that SDO);
- > In the field "Subindex" insert the subindex of SDO (coordinated with the SDO);
- > In the field "nbyte" insert the length of the SDO;
- ➤ In the field "Mnemonic" you can insert a brief description of the command.

## Example 1:

If You want to read the SDO at:

- Address 22;
- Index 0x3000;
- Subindex 2;
- By dimensions 2 byte;

from a DeviceNet Master, you have to define the SDO like showed in Figure 5. Gateway takes SDO data in the first two bytes of the DeviceNet Array.

The Gateway, in DeveceNet side, is a Slave and in order to read/write the bytes, you can use the following I/O messages:

- > Strobe Bit;
- Polling;
- Cyclic;
- > COS.




Figure 6: Chart of SDO request from Devicenet side.



## **SET PDO ACCESS:**

The following objects can be defined within the "Set PDO Access" section:

- > Transmit PDO, they take the data from DeviceNet Array;
- > Receive PDO, they put the data in DeviceNet Array.

By pressing the "Set PDO Access" button from the main window for SW67134 (Fig. 3) the window "Set PDO Access" appears (Fig. 7).

The data of the columns have the following meanings:

- ➤ In the field "Cob-ID" insert the Cob-ID of the CANopen PDO;
- > In the field "Dimension" insert the length of PDO;
- > In the field "Mnemonic" you can insert a brief description of the command.

## Example 1:

If you want to Write a Transmit PDO with:

- > Cob-Id **0x201**;
- > Dimensions 2 byte.

from DeviceNet, you have to define the PDO like showed in Figure 7. Gateway takes PDO Data from the DeviceNet Array. The position in this array depends of how many SDO do you set in the section SDO DeviceNet IN.

The Gateway, in DeviceNet side, is a Slave and in order to read/write the bytes, you can use the following I/O messages:

- Strobe Bit;
- Polling;
- Cyclic;
- > COS.

By clicking this button, the user can create a valid EDS file for CANopen side.


#### **UPDATE DEVICE:**


Section "Update Device":

In order to load the parameters or update the firmware in the gateway, follow these instructions:

- > Turn OFF the device;
- > Connect the Null Modem cable from your PC to the Gateway;
- Insert the Boot Jumper (For more info see the "Connection scheme" of the gateway);
- > Turn ON the device;
- Check the "BOOT Led". It must blink quickly (more info see the "Connection scheme" of the gateway);
- > Select the COM port and press the "Execute update firmware" button;
- > When the operation is finisched turn OFF the device;
- Disconnect the Boot Jumper;
- Turn ON the device.

At this point the configuration/firmware on the device is correctly updated








Figure 8: "Update device" windows

The connection from RS232 socket to a serial port (example one from a personal computer) must be made with a NULL MODEM cable (a serial cable where the pins 2 and 3 are crossed).

It is recommended that the RS232C Cable not exceed 15 meters.





Figure 9: Null modem cabling
