




Figure 1a: Connection scheme for HD67931-B2-xxx




Figure 1b: Connection scheme for HD67931-B2-xxxMHz-0




Figure 1c: Connection scheme for HD67931-B2-xxxMHz-xxx




Figure 1d: Connection scheme for HD67931-B2-G43-xxx

- Update the device.






FUNCTION MODES:


The device has got two functions mode depending of the position of the 'Dip1 of Dip-Switch A':

- ★ The first, with 'Dip1 of Dip-Switch A' at "OFF" position, is used for the normal working of the device;
- ▶ The second, with 'Dip1 of Dip-Switch A' at "ON" position, is used for uploading the Project and/or Firmware.

For the operations to follow for the updating, see 'UPDATE DEVICE' section.

According to the functioning mode, the LEDs will have specifics functions, see 'LEDS' section.





LEDS:

The device has got two LEDs that are used to give information of the functioning status. The various meanings of the LEDs are described in the table below.





ETHERNET:

The Ethernet connection must be made using Connector3 of HD67931-B2 with at least a Category 5E cable. The maximum length of the cable should not exceed 100m. The cable has to conform to the T568 norms relative to connections in cat.5 up to 100 Mbps. To connect the device to an Hub/Switch is recommended the use of a straight cable, to connect the device to a PC/PLC/other is recommended the use of a cross cable.







M-BUS:

The M-Bus is a unpolarized bus.

A two wire standard telephone cable (JYStY N*2*0.8 mm) is used as the transmission medium for the M-Bus. The maximum distance between a slave and the repeater is 350m; this length corresponds to a cable resistance of up 29Ω . This distance applies for the standard configuration having Baud rates between 300 and 9600 Baud, and a maximum of 250 slaves. The maximum distance can be increased by limiting the Baud rate and using fewer slaves, but the bus voltage in the space state must at no point in a segment fall below 12V, because of the remote powering of the slaves. In the standard configuration the total cable length should not exceed 1000m, in order to meet the requirement of a maximum cable capacitance of 180nF. (*Taken from M-Bus specifics*)





M-BUS WIRELESS:


The standards of M-Bus Wireless are specified in EN 13757-4. The signal is @ 169 MHz or 433 MHz or 868 MHz (in relation to the order code).

The Antenna connector is a SMA Female ('Female Outer Shell' and 'Female Receptacle') so the Antenna must have a SMA Male connector.



LTE:

The Antenna connector is a SMA Female ('Female Outer Shell' and 'Female Receptacle') so the Antenna must have a SMA Male connector. The SIM type is Micro-Sim.

USE OF COMPOSITOR SW67931:

To configure the Converter, use the available software that runs with Windows called SW67931. It is downloadable on the site www.adfweb.com and its operation is described in this document. The software works with MS Windows (XP, Vista, Seven, 8, 10, 11; 32/64bit).

When launching the SW67931, the window below appears (Fig. 2).

NEW CONFIGURATION / OPEN CONFIGURATION:

The "New Configuration" button creates the folder which contains the entire device's configuration.



A device's configuration can also be imported or exported:

- → To clone the configurations of a Programmable "M-Bus / M-Bus Wireless / MQTT Converter" in order to configure another device in the same manner, it is necessary to maintain the folder and all its contents;
- ➤ To clone a project in order to obtain a different version of the project, it is sufficient to duplicate the project folder with another name and open the new folder with the button "Open Configuration".



SET COMMUNICATION:




Figure 3a: "Set Communication" window

By Pressing the "**Set Communication**" button from the main window for SW67931 (Fig. 2) the window "Set Communication" appears (Fig. 3).

The window is divided in different sections in order to define the different parameters of the converter:

- Select Device
- → Working Mode
- M-Bus
- M-Bus Wireless
- **→** MQTT
- ◆ Ethernet
- → Wi-Fi
- → TLS (Transport Layer Security)
- ▶ NTP (Network Time Protocol)

SELECT DEVICE:

This section is used to select the converter in use. It is possible to define:

- **→ Only Ethernet Cable**: MQTT is available on LAN port.
- **▼ Ethernet Cable + Wi-Fi**: MOTT is available on Wi-Fi and LAN port.
- ▶ Ethernet Cable + Mobile Connection: MOTT is available on LTE and LAN port.

WORKING MODE:

This section is used to define the working mode of MOTT side of the converter. It is possible to define:

- → Standard Mode: on MQTT side, the data inside the payload of the messages are already readable and coded in relation to the user definition.
- Raw Mode: on MOTT side, it is possible to see the M-Bus responses in raw, without any decoding.




Figure 3c: "Set Communication → Working Mode" window

M-Bus:

This section is used to define the main parameters of M-Bus line. The means of the fields are:

- In the field "M-Bus on Wire" it is possible to define if the port is present or not:
- In the field "Baudrate" the data rate of the M-Bus line is defined;
- Bus scanning is defined:
- ★ In the field "Node State value when slave device is not present" it is possible to insert the value to assign to the "Node State" when the Gateway doesn't find the interrogated M-Bus slave;
- → If the field "M-Bus request only when MQTT is connected" is checked, the converter reads M-Bus side only if MQTT is connected.




Figure 3d: "Set Communication → M-Bus" window

M-Bus Wireless:

This section is used to define the main parameters of M-Bus Wireless line. The means of the fields are:

- → In the field "M-Bus on Wireless" it is possible to define if the port is present or not;
- ★ In the field "Mode" the communication mode is defined;
- ▶ In the field "Radio Channel" the radio channel is defined (only for 169 MHz).




Figure 3e: "Set Communication → M-Bus Wireless" window

MQTT:

This section is used to define the main parameters of MQTT line. The means of the fields are:

- → In the field "Server URL" the URL or the IP Address of the MQTT Server is defined;
- In the field "Server Port" the port used for MOTT communication is defined;
- ♣ In the field "Client ID" the Client ID of the converter is defined (if ned):
- In the field "Keep Alive (seconds)" the delay with which the Keep Alive message is sent on MQTT is defined;
- → If the field "Clean Session" is checked, the last MQTT messages are deleted by the Server and the Client in case of missing ACK. If unchecked, the Server and the Client hold the last MQTT messages and, in case of incorrect disconnection or missing ACK, they try to send again them since all the ACK messages are exchanged correctly (valid only for QoS 1 and QoS 2);
- ▼ If the field "Will Flag" is checked, the converter will publish the Will topic at the connection to the Server. With this feature, in case of incorrect disconnection, the Server will publish this topic to all the MQTT Clients that subscribed it;
- ♣ In the field "Topic Name Will" the topic used for Will message is defined;
- ★ In the field "Message Will" the payload of the Will message is defined;
- → In the field "Retained Will" the converter will send the Will message with Retain flag enabled. In this way, the Server will hold the last Will message;
- → In the field "QoS Will" the QoS type for Will message is defined;

- In the field "Username" the username for the connection to the MOTT server is defined;
- ▶ In the field "Password" the password for the connection to the MQTT server is defined.

ETHERNET:

This section is used to define the general parameters of Ethernet. The means of the fields are:

- ▶ In the field "Ip Address" the IP address of the converter is defined;
- ▼ In the field "SubNet Mask" the Subnet Mask of the converter is defined;
- ▶ In the field "Gateway" the default gateway of the net is defined. This feature can be enabled or disabled pressing the Check Box field. This feature is used for going out of the net;
- → In the field "DNS" the DNS address is defined. This field is required if the server address is define by URL and not IP Address;
- ▶ If the field "Reset Every 24h" is checked, the converter restarts every 24 hours.

WI-FI:

This section is used to define the general parameters of Wi-Fi. It is possible to defined the type of Wi-Fi communication:

- Access Point;
- Client.

The means of the fields for Access Point configuration are:

- In the field "IP Address" the IP address of the converter is defined;
- → In the field "Subnet Mask" the SubNet Mask of the converter is defined;
- → In the field "GATEWAY" the default gateway of the net is defined. This feature can be enabled or disabled pressing the Check Box field. This feature is used for going out of the net;
- → In the field "DNS" the DNS address is defined. This field is required if the server address is define by URL and not IP Address.
- → In the field "Port" the port used for MOTT communication is defined;
- ♣ In the field "SSID" the name of the Wi-Fi network to create is defined;
- ♣ In the field "Password" the password used for Wi-Fi connection is defined;
- In the field "Type" the type of security protocol used by the Wi-Fi network is defined;
- → If the field "Enable DHCP" is checked, the converter acts as DHCP Server for the Clients connected. If the option is enabled, in the fields "DHCP First IP Address" and "DHCP SUBNET Mask" the IP Addresses range used for DHCP is defined. In the field "Lease Time (seconds)" the required time for the renewing of the IP Address assigned to the Client is defined;
- → In the field "Max Client" the maximum number of Wi-Fi Clients accepted is defined;
- → In the field "Channel" the channel for Wi-Fi communication is defined.




Figure 3h: "Set Communication → Wi-Fi" window




Figure 3i: "Set Communication → Wi-Fi" window

TLS (TRANSPORT LAYER SECURITY):

This section is used to define the parameters of TLS protocol. The means of the fields are:

- → If the field "Enable TLS" is checked, the TLS protocol for secure connection is enabled;
- → If the field "Server Authentication" is checked, the authentication of the Server using TLS is enabled. If enabled, in the field "Server Certificate" the certificate from the Server is defined;
- If the field "Client Authentication" is checked, the authentication of the Client using TLS is enabled. If enabled:
 - o in the field "Client Certificate" the certificate from the Client is defined:
 - in the field "Client Key" the private key of the Client is defined;

- → In the filed "Authentication Type" the type of connection required for the APN is defined;
- → In the field "Username" the Username for the APN connection is defined;
- → In the field "Password" the Password for the APN connection is defined.

MQTT SET TOPIC:

By Pressing the "MQTT Set Topic" button from the main window for SW67931 (Fig. 2) the window "Set MQTT Topics" appears (Fig. 4). This section is used to define the MQTT topics where the converter will publish the data from M-Bus.




Figure 3k: "Set MQTT Topics" window

The means of the fields are:

- ▼ In the field "Topic" the MQTT topic is defined;
- → If the field "Retained" is defined, the retained flag is enabled. The MQTT server will hold the last topic published;
- ♣ In the field "QoS" the QoS level is defined;
- → In the field "Template" the payload of the MQTT message is defined. It is possible to link the data into the message using the specific keywords listed;
- ▶ In the field "Mnemonic" a description of the topic is defined.

M-BUS




Figure 5a: "M-Bus Network" window

By Pressing the "M-Bus" button from the main window for SW67931 (Fig. 2) the window "M-Bus Network" appears (Fig. 5).

In the section "Nodes" it is possible to create the nodes of M-Bus line:

- ▼ In the field "Description" it is possible to write a short description of the node.
- → In the field "M-Bus Type" it is possible to select if the node uses M-Bus (on wire) or wM-Bus.

SECTION NODES (M-BUS NODES):

- ❖ In order to create a new node it is necessary to select which address use, selecting "Primary ID" or "Secondary ID", to makes the requests and then insert the "Primary Address" (from 1 to 250) or the Secondary Address" (from 0 to 99999999) of M-Bus device.





Figure 5b: "M-Bus Network" window







UPDATE DEVICE:

By pressing the "**Update Device**" button, it is possible to load the created Configuration into the device; and also the Firmware, if necessary. This by using the Ethernet port.

If you don't know the actual IP address of the device you have to use this procedure:

- → Turn OFF the Device;




Figure 6: "Update device" windows




